Notes & Instructions

1. The Academy's Civil Rights Representative assures compliance with the Americans with disabilities act of 1990, Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat. 327, the rehabilitation act of 1973, Public Law 93-112, 87 Stat. 355, the Elliott-Larsen civil rights act, Act No. 453 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 37.2101 to 37.2804 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, and the Michigan handicappers' civil rights act, Act No. 220 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 37.1101 to 37.1607 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
2. The Academy Board directs the designee to take such action as is necessary to assure that the Academy adheres to all of the non-discriminatory laws described under state and federal law.
3. The Academy Board is allowed to designate a "position." It does not have to be person-specific.
