
### MICHIGAN'S EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT REPORT CARD

Michigan College Access Network is committed to monitoring statewide college access and success data through our public Michigan Educational Attainment Report Card. The dashboard utilizes benchmark data from the year 2012-13, and is updated annually to provide the most current available data for each goal and outcome measure.

The following is a snapshot of the current (or most up-to-date) available data for each goal and outcome measure. Arrows indicate if the outcome measure has gone up or down since the baseline year.
