>> KEY PRINCIPLES:

- Ongoing, formative assessment
- Recognition of diverse learners
- Group Work
- Problem Solving
 - focus is on issues and concepts
- Choice
 - student choice in their reading and writing experiences and in the tasks and projects they complete

Disabilities

- >> intellectual disability
- hearing impairment (including deafness)
- >> speech or language impairment
- >> visual impairment (including blindness)
- serious emotional disturbance
- >> orthopedic impairment
- >> autism
- >> traumatic brain injury
- >> other health impairment
- >> specific learning disability
- >> deaf-blindness
- >> multiple disabilities

and who, by reason thereof, needs special education and related services.



Special Education Means:

SPECIALLY DESIGNED INSTRUCTION is provided, at NO COST to the parents, to meet the UNIQUE NEEDS of a child with a disability



Specially Designed Instruction

- Addresses the unique needs of an individual [resulting from the disability]
- Ensures access to the general curriculum so educational standards can be met

Building an Individualized Educational Plan IEP



Specially Designed Instruction (SDI)

is customized instruction by identified special education providers informed by student current needs.....

and addresses academic and/or behavioral needs that arise from a disability that, in general education, inhibits proficient knowledge and skill acquisition, retention, expression, and application



Specially Designed Instruction

For students with disabilities; SDI is <u>REQUIRED</u>, rather than beneficial, to access the grade level curriculum



Specially Designed Instruction

- Necessary, but not always sufficient for a student; the student may also need interventions.
- >> Student may benefit from tier II and tier III supports (both academic and behavior).



MTSS: Multitiered System of Supports



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Specially Designed Instruction

Is <u>not</u> an accommodation and/or modification, but may be provided to teach a student how to use an accommodation (e.g. extra time or break)
