Photojournalism - Telling the Story with Photographs (20 seats available)	Photojournalistic images can reveal great truths, expose wrongdoing and neglect, inspire hope and understanding and connect people in their communities through the language of visual understanding. This is the day-to-day challenge of photojournalists as they practice the craft of capturing the human experience with their cameras. This session will explain the basics of good photojournalism through fair and honest images with lessons on how to tell the best story with pictures.	<u>Photojournalism</u>

Communications - Making the Best of Group Projects: CommunicationFailures and How to Avoid or Fix Them (25 seats available)	When you're assigned to work on a group project for a class, you get information about the assignment, but you don't usually get much advice about how to communicate with your group members to make the project successful. For decades, researchers have been studying how people communicate in groups and, it turns out, some common mistakes lead to bad decisions and unhappy group members. This session will help you avoid common mistakes, address them when they do occur, and communicate more effectively with group members to make the best of your group projects.	Communications
